

Northwest Tech History

The Oklahoma system of vocational-technical education was created by legislation in 1963. Northwest Technology Center was created in 1969, with classes beginning in 1972.

Northwest Technology Center's District stretches from the Oklahoma/Kansas state line south to near Watonga. It encompasses all of Woods County, the majority of Major County and parts of Blaine, Alfalfa, Woodward, Harper and Dewey counties.

Technology Centers were created to consolidate resources for expensive educational programs to serve a wide geographical area. Initially, the centers were to serve high school juniors and seniors. Services to adult students were added within a few years.

In the 1980's Business and Industry Services were offered by Technology Centers. Today business and industry training and adult training and development activities are over 90% of the student enrollment!
